The "Investicast" Project

Brief Overview: Here it is friends, our first unit of second semester! As always, I'd like to remind you all that the focus of ELA 12 is "Real-World Writing and Literature" so this unit provides us with the opportunity to do just that by creating a popular format of literature: podcasts. During this unit you will collaborate with your peers, conduct research on an issue that has two (or more) sides, and synthesize that information in a podcast you fully script and produce. Ultimately, this unit requires you to evaluate a topic from all angles, as well as to thoroughly investigate all available sources thereby allowing you to continually practice your ability to discern the "objective" truth for yourself.

- What are the elements of an effective podcast?
- How does one effectively research and articulate both sides, objectively, to a debatable topic?
- How does one effectively synthesize a plethora of sources into one cohesive, organized presentation of information?

- What is the role and power of language, information, and media in meaning making from podcasts?
- How are human beings "meaning makers" with multimodal literature?


